The BYU College of Engineering hosts a student competition each year in partnership with the Marriott School's Rollins Center for Entrepreneurship and Technology. The annual SIOY competition, **open to all BYU students**, has kickstarted now-successful companies Owlet, Khione, and MyoStorm over its 10-year history. Students **receive up to \$400 in funding to kickstart their idea** and compete for a piece of \$50,000 to make their idea a reality. Competitors apply Fall 2020 and compete Winter 2021.
